What is Mold?

How Can I Prevent Mold Growth?

Always remember to wear protective gear, so as to help prevent some of the health issues mold can cause.

Should mold be discovered in your house, don't wait for it to become a serious problem before you decide to take action. Mold isn't a project completed after a few swipes of a bleach-soaked cloth, and it is not an issue that should be swept under the rug until a “convenient time” is found to deal with it. Within 24 hours of the water damage, mold begins to grow, and then the real danger begins.

Mold Removal and Water Damage Restoration

The process of cleaning mold isn't as simple as you may think. Outside of protective gear such as gloves, boots, a mask, eyewear, and long sleeves, you will also need to test the mold to see the areas that have the highest concentration. Once you've found the source, create negative air pressure to provide a constant circulation of fresh air to make airborne contaminants go outside, where they belong.

After that's all discovered and set up, you will then have to sheet the area in a plastic covering to protect the adjacent rooms and keep the mold spores from spreading further than where they originated. Remember, wiping the area sends the spores into the air, which is when it spreads and ingesting it becomes the real threat. Be sure to keep your dust mask over your face to avoid unwanted inhalation.

You will have to use the proper chemicals to remove the mold, then dispose of the tools you've used, as well as the plastic covering and any material that may have been affected by the mold's growth. Once that process is complete, a proper application of mildewcide will need to occur to prevent further infestation.
